Speaker:-

Jacqueline Smith then gave an informative talk and presentation on the Bevin Boys. She explained how mining was not a reserved occupation so with miners leaving for the war, Ernest Bevin was tasked with filling the shortfall. When not enough people volunteered –("Optants") conscription was started using a ballot system based on the last number of recruits' National Service Registration numbers.(Ballotees) Many people wrongly accused the "Optants" and "Ballotees" of being conscientious objectors and they had to win over the respect and understanding of the miners. They were not given an official uniform and when they were demobbed in 1948, were not given the financial support or medals that military veterans were provided with. In 1989 the Bevin Boy Association was formed which campaigned for recognition resulting in being allowed to take part in the march past the Cenotaph on Remembrance Days between 1998 and 2012. Surviving veterans also received a Bevin Boy Veteran Bage in 2008. The Association created and issued its own medal.
