What does the role involve?

WE WANT YOU Trustees are responsible for: passing on information from the NFWI to members, setting the federation's budget and overseeing its finances, attending meetings (such as Board meetings, sub-committee meetings etc.) and engaging in discussion, debate and voting, issuing an annual report and accounts and organising events and activities for members.

How do I become a Federation Trustee? A Trustee must be a member of a WI in our Federation. WIs elect Trustees at their federation's Annual Meeting. They can hold the position for up to three years at a time. Trustees can also be co-opted onto the Board at a later date.
