The Noble Grape: Richard Ballantyne MW: Richard explained how he had come to be a Master of Wine, the only one in Wales and one of 430 world-wide. He explained about the challenging examinations and dissertations he had to complete. He then explained the history of wine, which dates at least to the Neolithic, and also explained that to be wine, the product must be no less than 8% alcohol, meaning that so-called non-alcoholic wine cannot be called wine. He gave those who wished, an opportunity to taste a white and a (chilled) red Portuguese wine.
